Installation of new wall-mounted acoustic soundboard panels on the South and North walls of the church worship space (Nave and Chancel), which will be at two levels (upper and lower) and which will be aligned with each other, in the spaces between the windows, and (provisionally) to have panels also underneath the windows. so that your letter reaches the registrar not later than 01/09/2022. A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.

Directions to petitioner

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
